

Week 6: The Apostles' Creed Pastor Derek Vreeland

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. - Acts 2:42 NRSV

The Apostles' Creed is the earliest summation of Christian belief which is based on the witness of the Apostles as recorded in the New Testament.

The Apostles' Creed:

- 1. is the symbol of faith
- 2. is the DNA of the Chrisitan faith
- 3. is our pledge of allegiance
- 4. forms us in the Christian faith
- 5. gives us the orthodox boundaries of the faith so that we can explore our doubts, wrestle with our questions, and grow in the faith
- 6. binds us together in Christian unity
- 1) I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth
- 2) I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord
- 3) He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary

"Conceived by the Spirit" means Jesus is God. "Born of Mary" means Jesus is human. The word we use for this is incarnation.

4) He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried
Christ Jesus died for our sins according to the Scriptures 1 Corinthians 15:3
The word we use to describe this is atonement.
"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." - John 1:29

5) He descended to the dead
6) On the third day he rose again
7) He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father
8) He will come to judge the living and the dead
Let's talk about hell.
There have been various interpretations of hell throughout church history including: 1. Eternal conscious torment (infernalism) 2. Annihilationism (conditional immortality)

3. Christian universalism (apokatastasis)

Jewish eschatology divided things up not into *time and eternity*, but into this present evil age and the age to come.

In the age to come there will be people in the kingdom and those outside the kingdom. The experience outside of God's kingdom will be like being in an outer darkness, a place of weeping and gnashing of teeth, a place of isolation, and the torment will not be literal flames, but the experience of exile away from the presence of God.

There are only two kinds of people in the end: those who say to God, "Thy will be done," and those to whom God says, in the end, "Thy will be done." All that are in Hell, choose it. Without that self-choice there could be no Hell. No soul that seriously and constantly desires joy will ever miss it. Those who seek find. Those who knock it is opened. — C.S.
