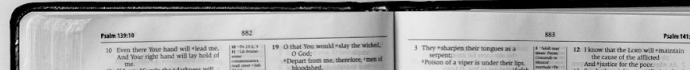

Psalms are read daily during prayer. Proverbs are read one chapter per day in January.

Reading the New Testament According to the Church Calendar

Advent: Mark 1-8, Matthew 1-15, Luke 1-9:17 (*up to the Transfiguration*), John 1-10 (*repeat*)

Christmas: Luke 1-2, Matthew 1-2, Mark 1, John 1 (*repeat for the 12 days of Christmas*)

Epiphany: Gospels on repeat, Mark, Matthew, Luke, John (*always in that order*)

Lent: Mark 9-15, Matthew 16-27, Luke 9:18-23, John 11-19 (*Transfiguration to Crucifixion*)

Holy Week: Mark 14-15, Matthew 26-27, Luke 22-23, John 18-19 (*Passion narratives*)

Easter Week: Mark 16, Matthew 28, Luke 24, John 20-21 (*Resurrection narratives*)

Eastertide: Resurrection narratives, Acts-Revelation (*Repeat for 50 days until Pentecost*)

Ordinary Time: The New Testament on repeat
